

An invitation from Pastor Kristina Mico for the SWOT team to attend the Cunderdin Christian Fellowship dedication/opening on Sunday, 12 March was received much with excitement. When so many churches in the country are closing, what a privilege indeed to witness first hand the birth of a new work.

Geoff and Margaret Pittuck, and Brad Makin accepted the invitation to attend the church opening making the 156 km trip east of Perth to Cunderdin. Vases of flowers placed on the side piano had to be removed for fear they would topple due to the exhuberat praise of over 100 people singing, clapping and swaying in such a constrained space. I don't think that old CWA building had ever witnessed such glorious exultation.

Brad explained to the congregation how providentially an innocent place-name misunderstanding had gotten SWOT connected with Cunderdin, in particular with Pastor Kristina.


From humble beginnings, the difficulties and trials that lead to the birthing of the church, was outlined by Pastor Kristina. In 2013, following one of the most intense tropical cyclones to hit the Philippines, killing more than 6,000 Filipinos, a couple of people went from house to house to collect money to raise funds to send to a foundation in the Philippines to help the typhoon victims. Through a series of events this resulted in a bible study being formed. From week to week the numbers swelled. Over time tthe group began to move from from house to house in order to reach more people. In February 2016, some of the believers found a church in Those that remained were Northam. burdened to have their own church service in Cunderdin. After much prayer, a building became available. And so it was the SWOT team found themselves at the

Cunderdin Christian Fellowship church dedication service, united as one people with dear servants of God, sharing in a joyful noise unto the Creator of Heaven and Earth.

Pastor John Pop, Church of Christ, Noranda, spoke from Matthew 16:13-18. Jesus brought his disciples to Caesarea Philippi, a dark place. Here Jesus said..."And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it". The mention of gates refers back to the OT references of gates of the city as being the place where the council of the city would meet, i.e. the seat of power and such were debated and approved. With this in mind we then can read Matthew 16.13-18 as "I will build My church and the plans and council of sation and his followers shall not previal against it.

A magnificent fellowship meal followed. We departed Cunderdin with greatful hearts for the new thing the Lord is doing in the hearts and lives of this community.
